Simple Beanie Tutorial

5. **Rounds 3-15:** Sc in each st around. Sl st to join.
6. **Decrease rounds:** (sc, dec) repeat around. (12 sc). Sl st to join.
Repeat this round 3 more times.
7. **Close:** Cut yarn and pull through the last stitch. Tighten and fasten off.

Slouchy Beanie Tutorial

For a more relaxed and comfortable fit, try this slouchy beanie.

1. **Create a magic ring:** As described in the beanie tutorial.
2. **Work in the ring:** 8 sc into the ring. Pull the ring closed and sl st to join.
3. **Round 1:** 2 sc in each st around (16 sc). Sl st to join.
4. **Round 2:** (sc, inc) repeat around. (24 sc). Sl st to join.
5. **Round 3:** (2 sc, inc) repeat around. (32 sc). Sl st to join.
6. **Round 4-20:** Sc in each st around. Sl st to join.
7. **Decrease rounds:** (sc, dec) repeat around. (24 sc). Sl st to join.
Repeat this round 2 more times.
8. **Close:** Cut yarn and pull through the last stitch. Tighten and fasten off.

Customization and Embellishments

- **Add a brim:** Create a flat circle by working in the round with sc until it reaches the desired width. Attach the brim to the hat by sewing or crocheting it in place.

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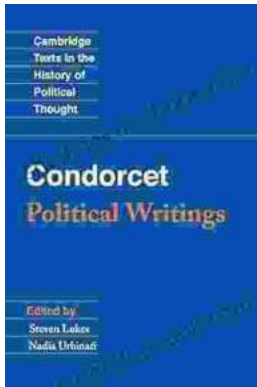
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
