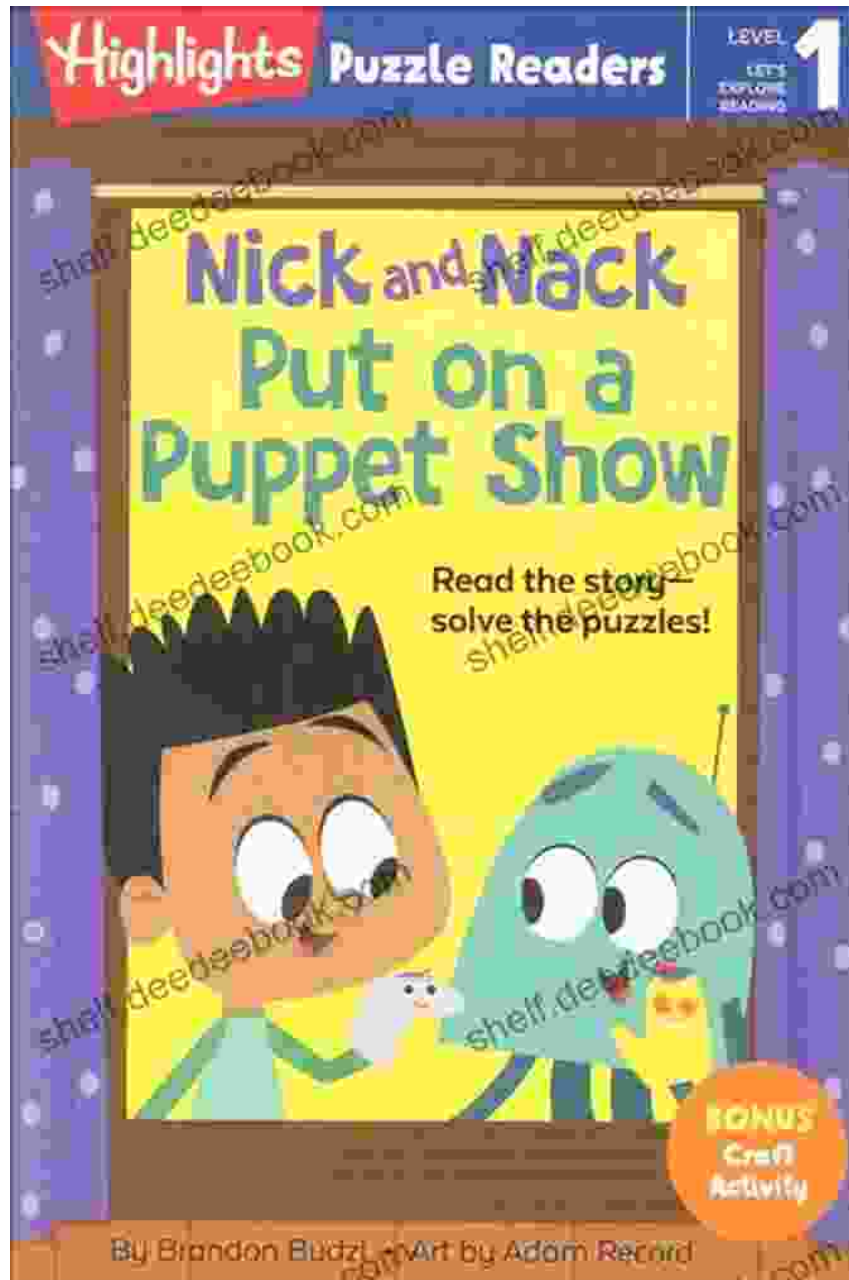
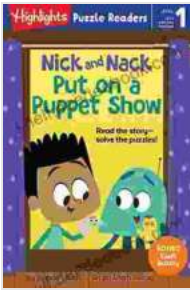

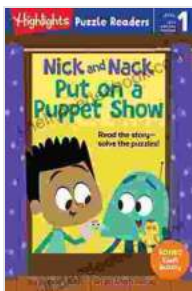
Logic Puzzles
