

- Irving Berlin (1888-1989): American composer and lyricist known for his songs "God Bless America" and "White Christmas." He also wrote the musicals Annie Get Your Gun and Call Me Madam.
- Jerome Kern (1885-1945): American composer known for his musicals Show Boat, Sally, and Very Good Eddie.
- **Kurt Weill** (1900-1950): German composer known for his musicals The Threepenny Opera and Lady in the Dark.

Lyricists

• **Stephen Sondheim** (b. 1930): American composer and lyricist known for his musicals Sweeney Todd, Into the Woods, and Sunday in the Park with George.

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- Irving Berlin (1888-1989): American composer and lyricist known for his songs "God Bless America" and "White Christmas." He also wrote the musicals Annie Get Your Gun and Call Me Madam.
- E.Y. Harburg (1896-1981): American lyricist known for his collaborations with Harold Arlen on The Wizard of Oz and Bloomer Girl.
- Alan Jay Lerner (1918-1986): American lyricist known for his collaborations with Frederick Loewe on My Fair Lady and Camelot.
- Betty Comden (1919-2019) and Adolph Green (1914-2002):
 American lyricists and librettists known for their collaborations on On the Town, Singin' in the Rain, and Wonderful Town.
- Dorothy Fields (1905-1974): American lyricist known for her collaborations with Jerome Kern on Show Boat and Very Good Eddie.
- Howard Ashman (1950-1991): American lyricist known for his collaborations with Alan Menken on The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, and Aladdin.
- **Tim Rice** (b. 1944): British lyricist known for his collaborations with Andrew Lloyd Webber on Jesus Christ Superstar, Evita, and The Phantom of the Opera.

Directors


- George Abbott (1887-1995): American director known for his work on Broadway musicals such as The Pajama Game, Damn Yankees, and Fiorello!
- Jerome Robbins (1918-1998): American director and choreographer known for his work on Broadway musicals such as West Side Story, The King and I, and Fiddler on the Roof.
- Harold Prince (b. 1928): American director and producer known for his work on Broadway musicals such as The Phantom of the Opera, Evita, and Sweeney Todd.
- Michael Bennett (1943-1987): American director and choreographer known for his work on Broadway musicals such as A Chorus Line and Dreamgirls.
- Tommy Tune (b. 1939): American director, choreographer, and dancer known for his work on Broadway musicals such as Nine, Grand Hotel, and The Will Rogers Follies.
- **Trevor Nunn** (b. 1940): British director known for his work on musicals such as Les Misérables, Cats, and Sunset Boulevard.

- Cameron Mackintosh (b. 1946): British producer known for his work on musicals such as Cats, The Phantom of the Opera, and Les Misérables.
- Ziegfeld Follies (1869-1932): American producer known for his lavish Broadway revues.
- Shubert Organization: American theatre company founded in 1900, which has produced many Broadway musicals, including The Music Man, Hello, Dolly!, and A Chorus Line.
- RKO Pictures: American film studio that produced a number of musicals in the 1930s and 1940s, including Top Hat, Swing Time, and The Wizard of Oz.
- Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer: American film studio that produced a number of musicals in the 1940s and 1950s, including An American in Paris, Singin' in the Rain, and Gigi.
- Disney Theatrical Productions: American theatre company founded in 1994, which has produced a number of Broadway musicals, including The Lion King, Beauty and the Beast, and Aladdin.

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
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
